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WELCOME TO MISSOURI CITY

A vibrant, diverse community located just southwest of Houston in the heart of Fort Bend County, Missouri City is home to 110,026 residents within the city limits and 151,757 when including its ETJ. This growing community offers the perfect balance of suburban comfort and metropolitan access. Its strategic location along major highways like the Fort Bend Parkway and Highway 6 provides easy connectivity to Houston's business centers, airports, and cultural attractions.

Known for its strong sense of community, beautiful master-planned neighborhoods, and high quality of life. With more than 500 acres of developed parkland, over a dozen parks, and nearly 15 miles of multi-use trails, outdoor recreation is central to daily life. The city is also home to the Quail Valley Golf Course and Recreation Complex, a local gem for events, fitness, and family activities.

ORGANIZATIONAL CULTURE

Operating under a Council-Manager form of government, the City Council, comprising a Mayor elected at-large, two at-large Council Members, and four single-member district representatives, appoints a City Manager to oversee daily operations. This position will report to the Assistant City Manager.

City leadership fosters a results-driven environment where departments are empowered to lead and encouraged to seek creative, data-informed solutions. With a strong emphasis on transparency and strategic alignment, every department is expected to contribute meaningfully to the broader mission.

The Public Works Department plays a pivotal role in shaping Missouri City's growth, resilience, and quality of life. The department is structured to support internal collaboration and external responsiveness, balancing the needs of infrastructure, engineering, utilities, and development with long-term planning and public engagement.

The next Director of Public Works will join a collaborative leadership team where cross-departmental relationships are essential to success. The Director will be expected to lead with integrity, support professional growth among staff, and serve as a trusted advisor to city leadership.



- Promote a culture of safety, professionalism, accountability, and collaboration




OPPORTUNITIES & CHALLENGES
