Governance and Organization

Dalhart, Texas, is characterized by its efficient administration and community-focused initiatives. The city's government is structured around several key departments, ensuring comprehensive oversight and service delivery to its residents.

With a council-manager form of government, Dalhart's city council sets the vision for the community, empowering the city manager to lead the administration of municipal services. The city council consists of (9) nine members. The mayor, and each council member are elected to serve the residents and address local needs and concerns.

With an annual budget of nearly 16 million dollars, Dalhart is a regional center for travel and commerce. As a full-service city, Dalhart's departments consist of Animal Control, Municipal Court, City Secretary, Economic Development, Airport, Finance, Code Compliance, Human Resources, Parks, Police, Sanitation, and Water & Wastewater. For Fire services, the city is served by a 35member volunteer Fire Department and a full-time Fire Chief. The community's commitment to public safety is exemplified by its recent ongoing construction of a new Emergency Response Center. This state-of-the-art facility will house the police department, EMS and fire departments, enhancing their capability to serve and protect the community efficiently. The integration of these services within a single facility underscores the city's strategic approach to resource management and public safety.






The Position

Under the direction of the City Council, Dalhart's City Manager serves as the organization's chief administrative officer, ensuring daily operations align with the City Council's vision, policies, and community goals.

The position manages and coordinates projects, develops and presents the annual budget, monitors expenditures and the City's adherence to federal, state, and local laws, and serves as a sounding board for elected and appointed leaders, providing the background, data, and guidance they need to make informed decisions. It also assists in setting short-term and long-term goals for the organization with an eye on sustainable finances and maintaining Dalhart's excellent quality of life.

The successful candidate will develop the performance of City employees, review policies and procedures to improve customer service, and make recommendations to City Council as needed to keep the organization's workforce efficient and effective. The position is also responsible for contract administration and enforcing City laws, permits, and franchises.

As the organization's leader, the City Manager is responsible for providing direction and support to City departments, demonstrating exemplary character, resolving grievances, and inspiring employees. He/She should also play an integral role in representing the City to residents, developers, business owners, members of the media, neighboring communities regional organizations, and state and federal agencies.

Compensation and Benefits

The City of Dalhart is offering a salary range of \$105,000 - \$125,000 for this position commensurate with experience and qualifications. The organization also provides a competitive benefits package including vehicle allowance, employee medical insurance with dental and vision options, as well as term life insurance (family coverage available at additional cost to employee). Additional employee benefits include paid holidays, sick leave, vacation leave, and long-term disability.

The City of Dalhart participates in the Texas Municipal Retirement System (TMRS), which pairs a 5% employee contribution with a 2:1 employer match.

Residency in the City of Dalhart within 6 months is required.
